# A Story of Hope

Since our last news letter many of you have heard us speak about a young man by the name of Marcos Antonio. For those who don't know, he is about 19 years old and back in February 2006 fell off the back of the bus he was hanging onto. He was then hit by the car that was traveling behind the bus and sustained serious injuries.

One morning at the end of the drop-in centre some of the boys who had already left returned to say that Marcos was at the petrol station. Indeed he was, lying on his back on the pavement, moaning with pain, emaciated and with an open wound on his hip. It was a very sad site, we didn't think he would live for many

days, Marcos himself just kept crying for people to leave him alone so he could die.

Since then he has received regular baths and meals from the team who have also worked hard to keep his injuries dressed and now he is almost all healed up. It was good to see him at the Christmas party we had at the drop-in centre, in just a few weeks he had gained weight and was smiling again.

Although to date he is unable to walk he does have a wheelchair now so it's easier for him to get around. He still prefers to sleep on the street with his friends but there may be an opportunity for him to get some form of physiotherapy soon.

He hears the Gospel message each time he comes into the drop-in centre and knows a great deal about the Bible already so we hope and pray not just for his physical healing but for a spiritual one as well.

activity to complete. Each week we ask them to memorise something within the book. After table games, prayer and choruses we have a bible story and then break into small groups to listen to anything they have memorized and we often have some small activity for them to do. Michael looks after the 11's and up, a calm and non-threatening group whilst I (Janice) look after the 9-10's who are anything but calm. Each week has its highlights but the one in which one of the boys put a dead lizard down the back of a girl's t-shirt sticks in my mind more than most. It would be easy to think that nothing goes in to the minds or hearts of such children but then the next week there he is,



this same boy, standing at the front with only 2 others in front of all his friends confessing Jesus as his Lord and Savior

The last year and a half has gone so fast it doesn't seem that long ago that we were getting on a plane to come to Brazil. At that time our mid-term break was far from our minds as we had lots of language to learn and after that find a place where we could work

Well, the time has now come for us to think about a short break, we had planned to go back to the UK at Christmas 2007 but Michael's brother is getting married at the beginning of August so we will now be there for the whole of July and the first week or so of August. This fits in well with our children's schooling as well not being as cold (hopefully!) as December. We then plan to return to Brazil for at least a further 2 years which will not be long if time continues to go as quickly as it has done already.

Then we have something to eat together and general talking together. This has become a very precious time for us with anything from 8 to 12 of us as well as children.

The other great encouragement is the church we attend on a Sunday night. It only has about 50 people as it is quite new but we have good fellowship together.
